This has been an exciting three years for Neighborhood Pets Outreach & Resource Center, and for the families, cats, and dogs that our programming supports.

Each year in Cleveland, more than 96,000 Cleveland cats and dogs live in poverty without access to affordable resources for their care.

Thanks to your support, Neighborhood Pets has successfully helped over 2,800 low-income pet owners keep their pets happy and healthy by offering access to affordable basic wellness care, spay/neuter, supplies, education, and resources. Since 2016 we've offered direct access three days a week at our Slavic Village resource center, and this past year, we also began offering services on Saturdays at the Five Pointe Community Center in Collinwood.

Our human clients have one thing in common: they love their pets. Their pets provide much-needed friendship and a sense of purpose. When we are able to help them support the well-being of their dogs and cats, the quality of life improves for everyone. Keeping families together, healthy and happy—that's our goal.

This program has become a critical resource for saving and improving the lives of companion animals in Cleveland. We're grateful for your continued support.

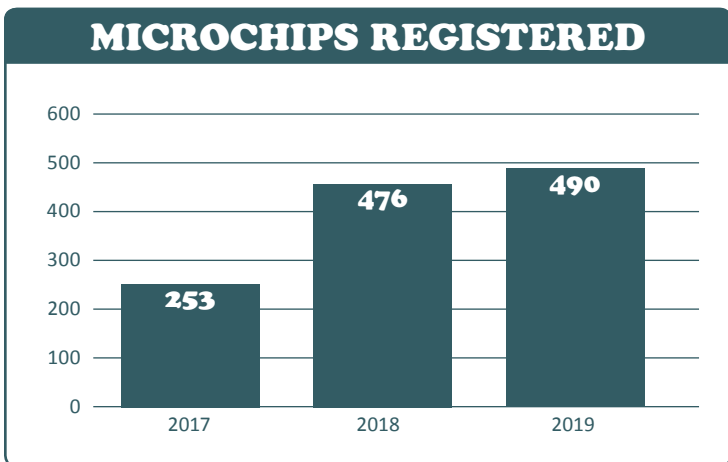
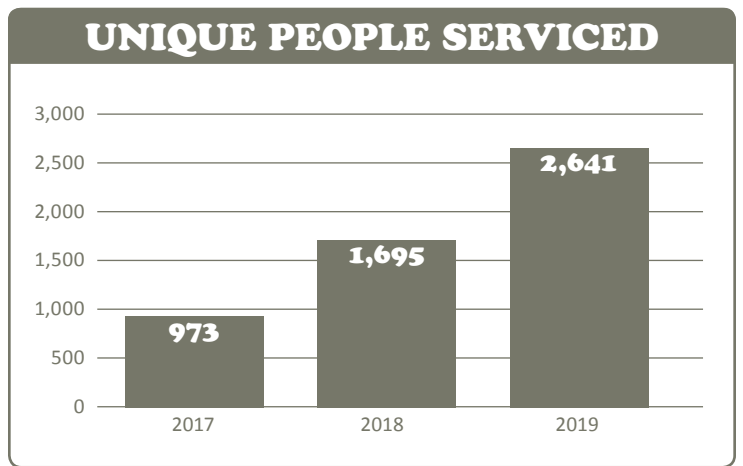
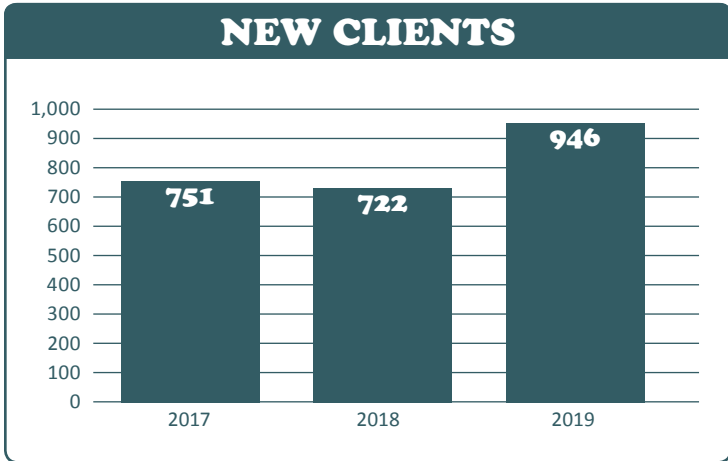

Euthanasia Cost Assistance: Dignity Fund

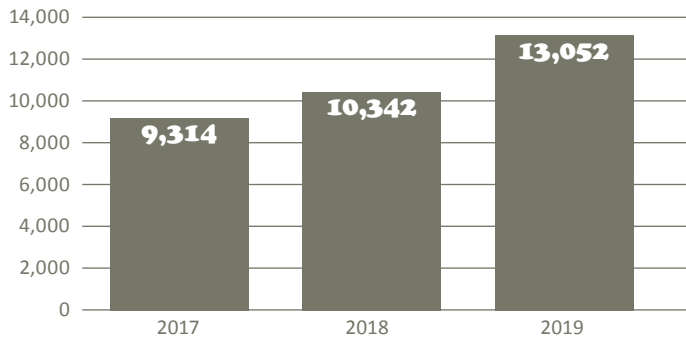

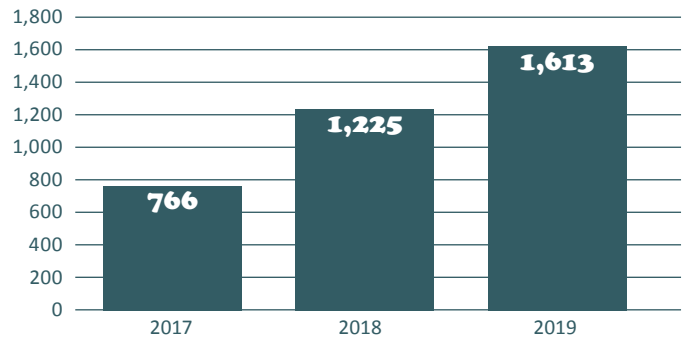

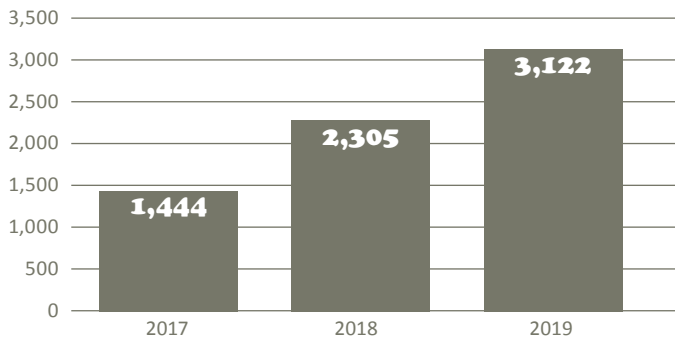
FOOD DISTRIBUTED IN POUNDS
